### **Victorian trainers to follow**

Let's take a look at the stats for Victorian trainers last season to see which were the best (and worst) stables for punters to follow.

The following trainers made at least 10% profit on turnover at level stakes in season 2008/9 and had at least 100 starters:

Vasil, Eurell, McCarthy, Harrison, Egan, **Salanitri**, Wheeler, Warren, Moloney, Oliver, Bennett and Scott.

And while 12 months is just a snapshot of a trainer's career, four of the stables above have made a level stakes profit over the last three seasons combined:

#### **John Salanitri 9% Profit on Turnover**

Doug Harrison 6% POT

John Wheeler 4% POT

Tony Vasil 3% POT

*(Please note these profit figures are based on tote prices only, so if you made the effort to find the best available odds you could improve these substantially).*

Based on those numbers it's worth taking a closer look at the following runners at Caulfield tomorrow:

Ready To Please Race 5 (Salanitri)

Maxisun Race 5 (Vasil)

Sand Sweeper Race 6 (Wheeler)

Doubly Sure Race 8 (Vasil)

On the other side of the ledger, there were a number of stables that lost more than 30% on turnover from 100+ starters last season. Some of the bigger names whose horses were well and truly overbet include Snowden, Laing, Moroney, Ellerton, Mayfield-Smith, Hyland, Musgrove, Ledger, McArdle, McLean and Hore-Lacy.
